Pilgrimage to the River Ganges

LC: Can I explain whether visiting the River Ganges would be special to a non-Hindu?

There are 2 parts to today's activity. Start with activity 1 and once complete, then move onto activity 2.

Activity 1

In previous weeks, we have learnt about why the River Ganges is important to Hindus and the rituals they may perform on pilgrimage such as bathing, praying, lighting Diva lamps and visiting a Mandir (Temple).



We watched 14-year-old British girl Simran and her friends describe their own experiences on a Hindu pilgrimage, saying it made them thankful to God, feelings of excitement, joy and peace and being in the River made her feel closer to God.

This week we are going to think about and discuss whether visiting the River Ganges can be special to someone who does not follow a Hindu religion. Instead, they may be Christian, Muslim, or may not follow religion at all.

Do you think a non-Hindu would want to visit the River and the town of Varanasi in India if they want to?

What do you think might be a reason they want to visit?

Once you have written your reasons down, then move on to activity 2.

Activity 2

Hopefully, some of your reasons why a non-Hindu may visit will match mine — you may even have some reasons that I don't and that's great because remember, it is totally your own thoughts and opinions.
