

Starting with untuned in EYFS, Glockenspiels in KS1 and ukulele in LKS2. - For each child to learn a varied programme of songs from different genres and having opportunities to perform. - For each child to have a basic knowledge on how to read music and understand the tune of the music.	Emerging	 Tameside Music Service have been engaged to provide WCET to Year 4 and Year 2. Tameside Music service to provide whole class singing lessons weekly with Year 1 class and to follow that class up each year to Year 6. Sing-up scheme available for learning songs in class including 2024-25 assembly repertoire. Front Row Music to be instructed by interested parents of KS2 children to provide them with private music tuition for piano, keyboard, guitar and ukulele.

To perform at annual Young Voices concert with ~40 KS2 pupils. Autumn and Summer performances with Victorious Trust events.
